

A word from the Afrikaada students in The Gambia

Afrikaada Gambia has since the summer of 2008 conducted introductions courses to dentistry. The idea was originally to fill our own needs of field worker. We are now working on establishing a more qualified education.

During the ATS visit in January and February of this year, these students worked with the dentists in the field. They assisted dentists, cleaned instruments, contacted schools, translated and much more. We couldn't have done our job without them.

We let some of these students tell us a bit about themselves. Here is some of what they wrote.

-I'm **Alpha o. Sey**, am 20 yrs of age. I'm studying because I want to be a dentist as my country is lacking dentist. I want to help my country in development of oral health.

- My name is **Jainaba Bah** I am 20 years old. I was a commerce student and I joined Afrikaada three month back, and am further my education. I want to serve the people of my country and others.

-My name is **Malick Jatta** I´m 21 year old. After high school I went on studying IT for 4 months. I have not completed my studies because of the principal ran away with our money and he also have loans from the banks of The Gambia then the banks close the institution that's how I stop my studies. Then I sat down for 9 months doing nothing, which was very sad and bad for me. A neighbor to me about Afrikaada course on dentistry. He called Mr. Sowe, who is a very good man, and told about me and we agreed on me coming to join Afrikaada, that's how I started. I want to be good at dentistry because in The Gambia there are not many dentists, which is not good for a developing country, like The Gambia, that's why Mr. Sowe tell us to learn and to know many things in life so that we can develop our country. During March and April Lars Göran Wärn, DDS, spent 3 weeks in Gambia mainly to organize matters at his private clinic in Koto but he also managed to work with ATS matters. Rashid one of his dentists is organizing a visit with a Spanish team that has promised, to amongst other materials leave a mobile unit behind. - Old friend English dentist Victoria Polland also spend some quality ATS time. Both Dr Polland and Dr Wärn took a day of and worked at the largest school in Serre Kunda extracting a number of badly damaged teeth. They also had a first hand view of the building site at Afrikaada Center in Pipeline, where classroom and clinic are on the way. Together with Afrikaada coordinator Sammba Sowe LGW meet with FIOH to hopefully organize travelling and treatment. LGW had a "new" unit installed in his private clinic. The unit is a gift from a FTV clinic in Region Skåne. At the same time 5 units were donated to ATS from the same clinic. Two of this are at the Mame Astou Janha Basic School in Kaolack in Senegal awaiting installment at the schools health center. The other 3 are to be installed in The Gambia. We are grateful to have received this gifts, they will make our job so much easier in the future - thank you so much.
